Community Initiatives Program - CIP

The Community Initiatives Program (CIP) funds initiatives that enhance and enrich communities throughout Alberta. The program:

- Reinvests revenues generated from provincial lotteries to communities
- Empowers local citizens and community organizations to work together
- Responds to local needs

Community Initiatives Program – CIP

The funding limits are:

- Project-Based Grant
 - maximum \$75,000
- Operating Grant
 - maximum \$75,000
- International Development Grant
 - maximum \$25,000

Community Facility Enhancement Program – CFEP

What projects might be funded by CFEP?

- CFEP funding provides financial assistance to build, purchase, repair, renovate, upgrade or otherwise improve sports, recreational, cultural or other related community facilities.
- Eligible organizations may apply for funding to carry out major renovations and repairs to the structural, electrical or mechanical systems in their facility

CIP and CFEP Application Information

CIP and CFEP applications, guidelines and financial accounting forms are available at:

www.culture.alberta.ca

Applications can be:

- submitted online
- mailed to Edmonton office (***recommended***)
- original signed grant agreement is required within 5 business days of online submission.

CIP and CFEP Application Deadlines

Application Deadline Dates:

- January 15, 2018
- May 15, 2018
- September 15, 2018

CIP and CFEP Highlights

- One capital and one non-capital grant per applicant per fiscal year (April 1 – March 31)
- Travel: \$10,000 maximum
- Celebrations: \$25,000 maximum
- Technology: \$50,000 maximum
- Playground grants only eligible in CFEP
- No retroactive funding in CIP and CFEP
- Municipalities are ineligible under CIP and CFEP
- Current CIP/CFEP application is required (check website).

CIP and CFEP Are Matching Grant Programs

- Maximum funding from the Alberta Government cannot exceed 50% of the total project cost.
- The other 50% of the project costs may include cash, donated labour, equipment, materials and other “in-kind” expenses.
